Laxmi, who likes to call herself a fighter and a survivor of acid attack which happened to her in 1990s shared her experience and requested



people to be more conscious and support her organization which takes in people who are victim of acid attack all over India. She also showed preview of her new TV show in India's News Express channel called Udaan.

Laxmi's State Department-sponsored visit to the U.S. was assisted in Dallas by the North Texas Council for Interna-

tional Visitors, a nonprofit that works with the U.S. diplomatic corps. The State Department began giving its awards in 2007 to non-U.S. citizens who show "exceptional courage" for women's rights and empowerment.

While in Dallas, she met Judge Roberto Cañas of Dallas County Criminal Court No. 10 who handles domestic violence cases. She also took part in a public roundtable discussion at the Flag Room of Dallas City Hall. Among them were leaders from a men's group fighting intimate-partner violence, a woman who survived domestic violence and a Texas Woman's University nursing professor.

Yet another Indian American has been named to a top academic job with the appointment of Sanjeev Kulkarni as the next Dean of the prestigious Princeton University Graduate School. Kulkarni, Professor of Electrical Engineering and Director of the Keller Center, succeeds William Russel. His appointment will be effective from March 31.

"Sanjeev Kulkarni will be a spectacular dean for Princeton's Graduate School," said Princeton President Christopher L. Eisgruber. "Sanjeev has a well-deserved reputation for excellence as an interdisciplinary scholar, a versatile administrator and a constructive colleague. "He cares deeply about the welfare of students, and he will be a thoughtful and effective advocate

for **g**raduate education in the years to come," Eisgruber said.

Kulkarni, who joined the Princeton faculty in 1991, said he appreciates the chance to serve the University and have an impact in a new role.

"Through more than 20 years as a faculty member and administrator, I have developed a very deep appreciation for Princeton," Kulkarni said. "It is an honor and a privilege to have the opportunity to serve the University in this capacity."


